Early Warning for All Initiative (EW4ALL)

Pillar 1 lead by UNDRR



Disaster risk knowledge

Systematically collect data and undertake risk assessments

- Are the hazards and the vulnerabilities well known by the communities?
- What are the patterns and trends in these factors?
- Are risk maps and data widely available?

Pillar 2 lead by WMO



Detection, observations, monitoring, analysis and forecasting of hazards

Develop hazard monitoring and early warning services

- Are the right parameters being monitored?
- Is there a sound scientific basis for making forecasts?
- Can accurate and timely warnings be generated?



Preparedness and response capabilities

Build national and community response capabilities

- Are response plans up to date and tested?
- Are local capacities and knowledge made use of?
- Are people prepared and ready to react to warnings?



Warning dissemination and communication

Communicate risk information and early warnings

- Do warnings reach all of those at risk?
- Are the risks and warnings understood?
- Is the warning information clear and usable?

Pillar 4 lead by IFRC

Pillar 3 lead by ITU

EW4ALL in Burundi



- EW4ALL Launched in Gitega, Burundi in 2023:
 - Reviewed the current state of early warning systems.
 - Strengthened existing national coordination mechanism to scale-up early warning programming across the four pillars
 - Identified gaps in national early warning systems.

- EW4ALL roadmap development & validation workshop in 2024
 - Developed actionable EW4All National Roadmap, around which all actors can marshal resources, technical assistance, and long-term support.

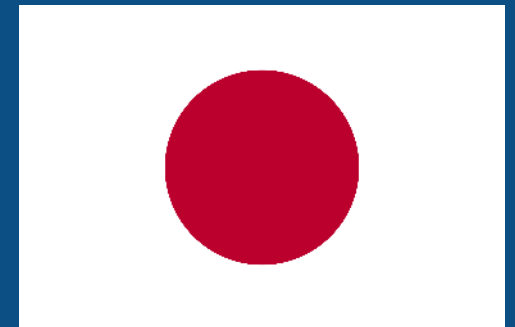
Africa Multi-Hazard Early Warning and Action System for Disaster Risk Reduction (AMHEWAS)

- Funded by the Government of Japan
- To increase technical support to Burundi on availability and quality of gender and disability disaggregated disaster data
- Rollout of handbook on the use of risk knowledge for multi-hazard early warning systems and inclusive early warning checklist

 - Gender and Disability Training in Kenya

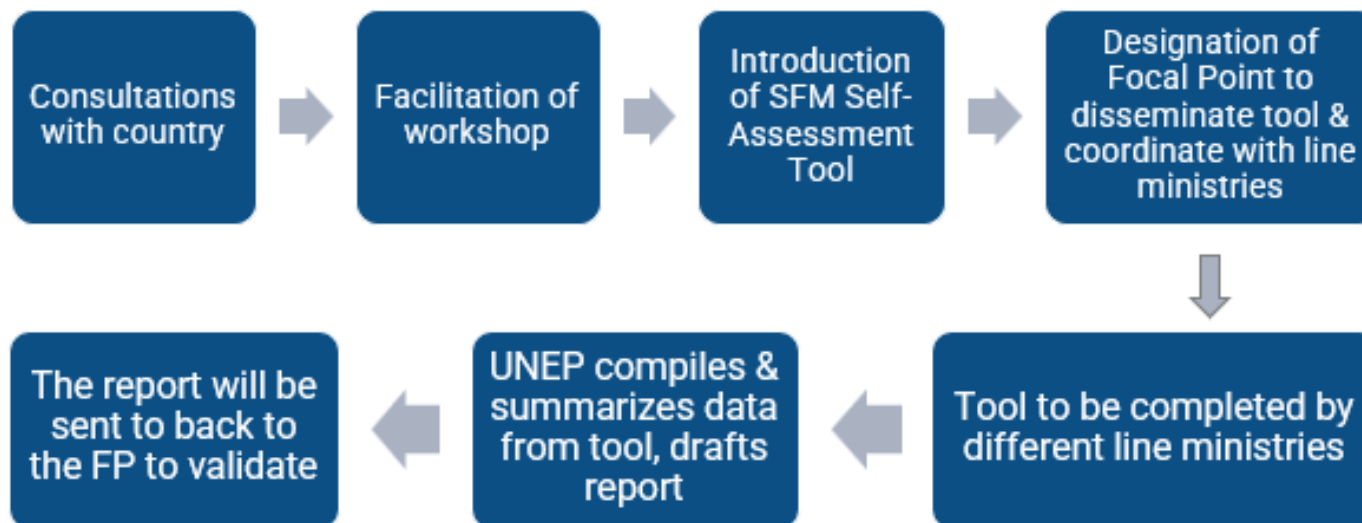
